What seat will be voted on at the Special Election?

City of Big Lake Voters will elect the following at the April 13, 2021 Special City Election: One (1) Council Member seat for the term expiring January 1, 2023

Who will be on the ballot?

Where can candidates and Voters find Special Election Results?

For State Primary and General Elections, candidates and voters are referred to the MN Secretary of State's (MN SOS) Website which has the most up-to-date election results. It is our understanding that for standalone Special Municipal Elections such as the April 13, 2021 Special Election, the State Website will NOT have information pertaining to our Special Election results.

Results for this Special Election will be posted on the City Website Special Election Page as soon as election judges have finalized in-person voting and the County Auditor's Office has finalized processing all Absentee ballots. Our hope is that un-official results will be posted sometime the evening of April 13, 2021, but the date/time of posting could be affected by the number of Absentee ballots, as well as any COVID restrictions that are in place. When will votes be official?

The Big Lake City Council will be holding a Special Meeting on Friday, April 16, 2021 to canvass the votes cast at the April 13, 2021 Special Election. The Special Meeting will begin at 1:30 p.m. and will be held in the Big Lake City Council Chambers located at 160 Lake Street North, Big Lake, MN. After the City Council canvasses the votes, they then become official.

Where do City residents vote for the Special Election on Election Day?

The City of Big Lake has three voting Precincts for residents who reside in the CITY of Big Lake:

⇒ **Precinct 1:** Big Lake City Hall, 160 Lake Street North


All CITY residents who live north of Hwy 10 and east of Lakeshore Drive or south of Hiawatha Avenue will vote at Big Lake City Hall (located at the intersection of Hwy 10 and 25).

⇒ **Precinct 2:** Big Lake Public Works Building, 18041 198th Avenue.

All CITY residents who live on the south side of Highway 10 will vote at the Big Lake Public Works Building (located by the new water tower site along Hwy 10).

⇒ **Precinct 3:** Saron Lutheran Church, 311 Lake Street South

All CITY residents who live north of Hwy 10 and west of Lakeshore Drive or north of Hiawatha Avenue will vote at Saron Lutheran Church.



Aquatic Invasive Species Treatments: Zebra Mussels in Big Lake

Due to the infestation of Eurasian Watermilfoil in Big and Mitchell Lakes, the City of Big Lake plans to chemically treat this invasive species in summer 2021. All treatment will be performed by a licensed commercial applicator. The method and chemicals used will be determined by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. There is no cost to the property owners on the lakes, but as a lakeshore landowner you may request that control does not occur adjacent to your property by contacting City Engineer Layne Otteson, at 763-251-2984 by May 1, 2021.

The Big Lake Community Lakes Association (BLCLA) would also like the community to be aware of the presence of zebra mussels, an aquatic invasive species, in Big Lake and Lake Mitchell confirmed by the Minnesota DNR in October 2020. **Zebra mussels can:**

- ⇒ Clog irrigation intakes and other pipes so lake water irrigation systems may need to be cleaned occasionally.
- ⇒ Attach to boat motors and hulls. Consider keeping your watercraft on a lift so the motor is out of the water.
- ⇒ Attach to something to grow such as rocks, sticks, native mussels, swim rafts and ladders.
- ⇒ Reduce available food for larval fish and other animals. Over time it can reduce the size of larger game fish.
- ⇒ Increase water clarity which may cause more growth of aquatic vegetation.

The BLCLA strongly encourages everyone to continue following the rules and recommendations of Clean, Drain, Dry and Dispose, and especially keeping watercraft, trailers and equipment 5 days dry before visiting a new body of water. The Minnesota DNR also suggests spraying items with high pressure and/or rinsing with very hot water. If you sell or move lake equipment such as docks, lifts, rafts, or pumps, it is recommended that the items be exposed to air for at least 21 days before using them in another lake.

Know the law. You may not:



- ⇒ Transport watercraft without removing the drain plug.
- ⇒ Arrive at lake access with drain plug in place.
- ⇒ Transport aquatic plants, zebra mussels, or other prohibited species on any roadway.
- ⇒ Launch a watercraft with prohibited species attached.
- ⇒ Transport water from Minnesota lakes or rivers.
- ⇒ Release bait into the water.

Please do your part in preventing the spread of zebra mussels and other AIS (Aquatic Invasive Species).

To obtain Resident rates, your address must be within the 55309 zip code. Either a seasonal or daily pass is required for parking from May 1 to October 31.

Municipal Liquor Store





Big Lake Police Department Co-Responder Program

The Big Lake Police Department is teaming up with the Sherburne County Sheriff's Office, Elk River Police Department, Becker Police Department and Central Minnesota Mental Health Clinic (CMMHC) to start a co-responder program.

What is a co-responder program? The co-responder program is intended to de-escalate situations involving someone with a mental illness or a person experiencing a mental health crisis without the use of force, and to provide those individuals with the appropriate services and resources. Each agency has designated one officer to work directly with a mental health professional from CMMHC. The mental health professional will work a Monday - Friday, 40-hour work week in Sherburne County. Each shift, the mental health professional will ride with the designated officer from one of the agencies.



When the mental health professional is riding with our Big Lake officer, they will respond to mental health related calls in our city and, if needed, in the county. Conversely, when the mental health professional is riding with an officer from another agency, they may respond to mental health calls in the City of Big Lake. The mental health professional will work directly with the person in crisis and can provide additional resources. If the mental health professional is not able to make it to the scene, they will follow up with the individual to ensure they are getting the help and support they need.

The co-responder program was initiated through a grant, with most of the expenses being covered. Each agency is contributing a small amount to help cover the remaining costs of equipment and other items needed to effectively operate. The cost is based on the population size of each agency. Big Lake Fire Department: Fire Prevention Reminders

The Big Lake Fire Department would like to highlight Fire Prevention reminders for the spring and summer months:

Smoke and CO Detectors: The spring-ahead of daylight savings time is a great reminder to check, change, and test the Smoke and CO Detectors in your home. Early detection of a fire saves lives as it is the smoke that will cause you to pass out, not the fire!

House Fire Prevention: Citizens are urged to use care when disposing of used cigarette products. A good number of house fires are caused by people disposing of these products in outdoor flower planters containing organic potting soil. Containers like these are often kept on decks and porches and can cause severe damage to your home.

Grilling Precautions: We recommend keeping a minimum of 10 feet clearance between any gas or charcoal grill and your house or deck railing when in use. Please do not place coals in a cardboard box or in a plastic garbage cart. They should only be placed in a steel container with a cover and disposed of when completely cooled.

Bonfire Recommendations: Please be responsible if having a recreational fire. We recommend not to exceed 36 inches in diameter, and 24 inches in height. Keep track of children; burns are very painful, and scars never go away. Have a water hose on hand to extinguish hot embers when finished. Remember, you can be held responsible if the fire gets out of hand and causes damage to your property or a neighbors' property. Let's work together to keep our families and neighbors safe this spring season!




Norm Michels: Streets, Parks, and Fleet Superintendent

Code Enforcement Reminders



City staff would like to thank residents for the time and energy that was spent maintaining safe, passable sidewalks this winter. There were very few instances that required City intervention, meaning a safer sidewalk system for everyone. Good job Big Lake!

Now that we are transitioning to spring, please be aware that parking is not permitted on front lawns. Unfortunately, front yard parking was a pervasive issue in the community last year, and required issuance of numerous citations. If you're running out of parking space in your garage and on your driveway, consider various options; it might be time to clean out the garage, explore off-site storage locations, or construct a parking pad. Parking pads can be located in side and rear yards with receipt of a zoning permit. If you would like to learn more about this option, please visit the City's website at biglakemn.org and click on 'Departments,' then 'Planning and Zoning,' and then 'Zoning Applications & Information.'

If you see something, say something... to your neighbor. Residents are encouraged to work through any issues they have with one another before submitting a request or submitting a City Code violation. Greater communications between neighbors help build a stronger community and promote the kind of friendly, small-town atmosphere we have come to value.

Water Shut Offs Begin April 15, 2021

Beginning April 1, 2021, the City of Big Lake will be mailing out notices to property owners for delinquent water bills. Only one notice will be given. Do I Need a Permit For That?



Spring is in the air, and with that comes the inspiration for home improvement projects! Staff is often asked what kind of permits are needed for a variety of home improvement projects. Some examples of required permits are listed below:

Generally, Building permits are required for:

- ⇒ Any new structure
- ⇒ Alterations or additions
- ⇒ Demolition
- ⇒ Re-roofing or re-siding a building

- ⇒ Window and/or door replacement
- ⇒ Detached accessory buildings over 200 square feet (sheds)
- ⇒ Replacement or installation of a fireplace, furnace or air conditioner
- ⇒ Replacement or installation of a water heater or water softener
- ⇒ Swimming pools, hot tubs, and spas that are more than 24 inches deep or have 150 square feet of surface area except for temporary storable swimming pools that are only set up outdoors between April 1 and October 31 each year. Storable swimming pools do not require a permit but still must follow most of the same set-back rules as permanent swimming pools.

Generally, Zoning permits are required for:


- ⇒ One story, detached accessory buildings 200 square feet or less (sheds)
- ⇒ Fences, driveways and parking pad installations

Generally, Engineering permits are required for:

- ⇒ Retaining walls over 4 feet tall measured from the bottom of the footing
- ⇒ Lakeshore restoration
- ⇒ Right-of-way permits
- ⇒ Anything requiring the use of a skid loader
